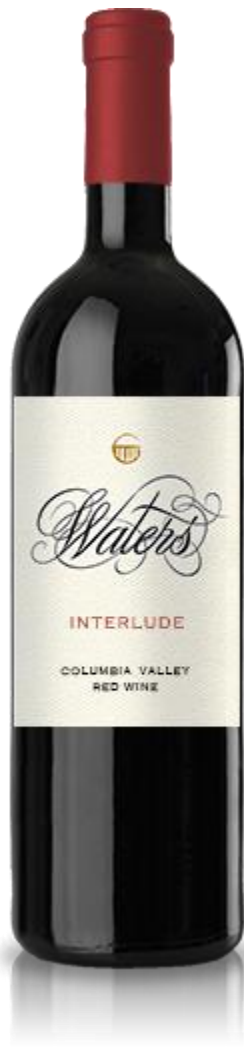




2013 Interlude

Vineyards

Fruit was sourced from Stone Tree, Seven Hills, Cold Creek, and Old Stones vineyards. This is one of the few wines where we focus on the wine as a greater sum than its parts as opposed to the wine as a vehicle for showing the vineyard—thus vineyard notes are omitted here.

Winemaking

2013 was hot and everything came in riper than normal, regardless of whether it was a site in the desert or in Walla Walla. Balance was difficult to achieve but by sourcing from several different vineyards and lots we were able to blend the personalities of each vineyard to create a seamless and well-balanced wine. Approachable now but will drink gracefully over the next decade.

Tasting Notes

Merlot makes up just over half of this wine, with Cabernet Sauvignon (39%) playing second fiddle and Cabernet Franc and Malbec rounding it out. It's expressive, with aromas of fig, golden raisins, eucalyptus and red fruit, with the aromas seeming slightly dried out. The palate is fruit forward and textured, while still showing restraint and length.
